When to Avoid Hiring a Tile Installer: 10 Warning Signs

You can't verify the name, address, phone number and other credentials of the installer. You feel pressure to pay upfront, or in cash and without a contract. You are offered a tile installation price that is "too good to be true." You can't obtain references and/or you can't reach any of the references. When you ask questions, you receive answers that are 5 uninformative or vague. 6 You consistently have trouble reaching the contractor. You feel that the tile installer is not listening to you and your requirements for the project. 8 You cannot see previous projects either in person, via the installer's website or through a presentation book of photos. 9 You see bad reviews online for the installer. You cannot confirm that the Tile Installer is a Certified Tile Installer (CTI) or has at least two years of verifiable experience as the lead installer setting ceramic tile on a full-time basis.
